OFFICER REPORTS

Exchequer – paid Donna for Coronation site. Hobby Lobby wouldn't recognize either of the tax documents, so Maewyn will 'talk' with them. Michaels was fine. For feast shopping, Maewyn and another signer will accompany Vitaliano shopping. This should make bookkeeping much easier.

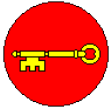
